Henry Jones, of St. Peter, was before Commissioner Cardozo yesterday charged with neglecting to cancel stamps on beer kegs. He was held to the grand jury in the sum of \$300.

The still alarm of fire at 6:50 o'clock last night was occasioned by the burning of a pile of rubbish in the rear of the Fire & Marine building. It was squelched by company No. 2.

There is a scarcity of copies of the Minnesota adjutant general's report issued Dec. 1, 1882, and covering the war years from 1861 to 1866, and the volume is at a premium and brings from \$15 to \$20 readily.
