A United Workmen's Suit.

WATERLOO, Ia., Jan. 27.—A trial of interest to the members of the Ancient Order of United Workmen, after a hearing of eleven days, was decided yesterday by Judge Utt. The facts are these: In 1882 the grand lodge of Iowa became incorporated under the state law and threw off allegiance to the supreme lodge. A minority of the grand lodge, however, remained loyal and was recognized as the regular grand lodge of the state by the supreme lodge. A suit was brought to determine the right to the franchises and property of the order. The court holds, that the mere act of incorporation under the state law has no power to release the subordinate body from its allegiance to the superior body of the organization.

CHARGES AGAINST GOV. MURRAY.

SALT LAKE, Utah, Jan. 26.—In an interview this afternoon, Gov. Murray says: No charges were ever filed in the department of justice when I was marshal of Kentucky years ago. The Mormon agents from Salt Lake and their allies and paid attorney at Washington and New York are making a determined effort to destroy his usefulness. Governor Murray sent the following dispatch this afternoon to Hon. Wm. M. Such statements are wholly false and malicious. I desire to notify your committee that I hold myself in instant readiness to meet and crush any such charges."
