IS MEMORIAM.—It will pain very many of our readers to learn of the untimely death of Dr. D. K. Southwick, of this place. This sad event transpired on the 11th inst. last Monday. Two weeks ago he left his office here in ordinary health, and went to the Gallatin Valley, and on yesterday his body was brought back for interment. Dr. Southwick had been a resident here for nearly six months, and his kindly manner, sympathetic habits, and his conscientious regard for his feelings of all with whom he came in contact, had made for him many warm and valued friends.

As the news of his death spread through the town on yesterday, large numbers of our citizens gathered together and made such arrangements for the burial as would testify their appreciation of the many many qualities of his head and heart, with which he was endowed. His medical attendant was a competent physician, and many friends alleviated his sufferings by such assiduous attention as his situation required. He was buried here last evening. His friends reside in Ashkuba, Ohio, and in this affliction, which falls all the more heavily on them because of his absence from home, they have the sincere sympathy of our entire community.

FIRST CHURCH OF MONTANA TERRITORY.—We have reason to be proud, and the citizens of Virginia City have reason to be proud, that their town contains the first church edifice in Montana Territory.

LAST SABBATH MORNING, at half-past ten o'clock, the church was filled with a respectable appearing congregation as would testify the presence in New York City, and after an appropriate sermon by Rev. A. M. Hough, the Pastor, it was announced that the Church had cost \$1,500, and that the debt now remaining was \$700, which it might be desirable to be cancelled at once, that it might be dedicated to the worship of God, free from all incumbrances, and the congregation was invited to subscribe for that object. It was pleasing to see the cheerfulness with which the call was responded to. Members of their own denomination, and of other denominations, and persons belonging to no church, sent in their subscriptions in quick succession, and in a few minutes it was announced that the sum of \$700 had been subscribed, and the church was declared free of debt. Such liberality in so good a cause, deserves public commendation, and is a very tangible evidence of the people's desire to increase moral and religious influence in the community. The Church was then formally dedicated to the worship of God.

This building belongs to the Methodist denomination. It stands on the north side of the town at the foot of Jackson street, and is large enough to seat about two hundred persons. It presents a tasteful internal appearance, and is furnished with an easy and commodious seats as can be found in any church. We only hope the place may soon become too straitened for the congregation, and that they may be compelled to enlarge to meet the wants of the community.
