Montana in New York.

A meeting of the citizens and property owners of Montana Territory now in this city was held on Saturday evening at 13 Bond street, C. R. Bissell in the chair.

Mr. E. R. Purple, chairman of the Committee on Organization, presented a report which was adopted. It declares that the organization shall be known as "The Montana Territory Society," the object of which shall be to promote the general welfare of Montana Territory, by diffusing trustworthy information of her resources and her wants.

The Territorial Committee, whose duty it shall be to regard especially the action of Congress and the territorial legislation in all things relating to the territories, and report the same to the society, with such recommendations as they may deem proper.

After the adoption of the report, the following officers were elected for the present year: James Tufts, President; George Wing, Secretary; and Walter C. Hopkins, Treasurer.
