GENERAL SHERIDAN.

His Removal from the Command of the Fifth Southern District—Officers of the President and General Grant making the transfer.

General Order No. 77. HEADQUARTERS ARMY, ADJ. GENERAL'S OFFICE, WASHINGTON, Aug. 19.

Major General George H. Thomas is hereby assigned to the command of the Fifth Military District, created by act of Congress passed on the second day of March, 1867.

Major General P. H. Sheridan is hereby assigned to the command of the Department of the Missouri.

Major General Winfield S. Hancock is hereby assigned to the command of the Department of the Cumberland.

Major General W. S. Hancock, on being relieved from the command of the Department of the Missouri, by Major General P. H. Sheridan, will proceed to Louisville, Kentucky, and assume command of the Department of the Cumberland.

Major General G. H. Thomas will continue to execute all orders he may find in force in the Fifth Military District at the time of his assuming command of it, unless authorized by the General of the army to annul, alter or modify them.

Major General Sheridan, before relieving Major General Hancock, will report in person at these headquarters.


