Another teamster, whose notions of a fight were, that when a man surrendered, the thing should end, stepped up, and seizing hold of the large man, jerked him off, and at the same time telling him that the other one had called for quarters, and he had beaten him enough. This aroused the implacable enmity of the bruiser against the intermeddler, and drawing his revolver, he shot him through the head. At the same time, number three had got his pistol out and fired three shots into the big teamster, killing him instantly, and then fell over, dead, as he was attempting to cock his revolver to fire the fourth shot.
