MT. HOOD WINS THE FIRST EVENT

The first event, the 2:35 trot, best two in three heats, was won by George Peringer's Mt. Hood, br. g., Westfield, by Ingram, driven by Frazer. In the first heat Mt. Hood, Erudition, Idle and Saxeine gave the starter considerable trouble. Erudition was the cause of it all. After a dozen breaks they were sent away, with Erudition away last, and his chances very poor. At the quarter pole Idle broke, and a little further Saxeine turned a similar trick. In the meantime Erudition was closing up the big gap and after the half mile overtook Mt. Hood. From then on it was a beautiful race between Finley's horse and the winner. They were nose apart into the stretch and it looked as though Erudition had a chance, but in

the last 100 yards Mt. Hood drew away and won easily. Erudition was all in at the finish and had not a stride left. Saxeine was third and Idle last, being distanced.

In the next heat Erudition got off last, but not so far behind as in the previous heat, and soon overhauled Saxeine. Mt. Hood was never in any danger and came in walking.

The betting in the first heat in the books was: Erudition, 1 to 2; Mt. Hood, 7 to 2; Idle, 6 to 1, and Saxeine, 12 to 7. The mutuels paid \$6.50 Mt. Hood to win and \$5.25 for place; Erudition paid \$3.40 for place. Erudition was driven by Hayes, Saxeine by Lewis, and McCauley held the ribbons over Idle. D. J. W.


