Business Picking Up in Police Circles—A Good List of Fighters and Other Small Charges for the Night.

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
A. J. Swift, a rapid gentleman of the street, was arraigned this morning for carrying concealed weapons.

BURNED THE APPLES

CREMATION OF A LOT OF WORMY AND INFECTED FRUIT.

NOTHING LEFT BUT THE ASHES

Only a Fraction of One Per Cent of the Fruit Coming to the City Is Discarded—A Good Record.

Seventy-five crates of apples were taken to the city crematory and burned this morning, by order of Fruit Inspector Edwards. The fruit was from Oregon, and was condemned for showing too evident traces of codling moth.

"But there is only a fraction of 1 per cent of the fruit shipped in that shows evidence of insect pests," said a member of the inspector force. "Less than 1 per cent, probably, of all the fruit brought to Butte is affected in any way. That is not at all bad for the western growers."

"Most of the affected fruit comes from California, Utah and Oregon, but even there the percentage is very small."

The fruit taken out and burned this morning is what has accumulated from the examination of several cars of apples that have arrived within the last few days. Apples are now getting to be the largest item in fruit imports.

The fruit is hauled to the city crematory, south of the city, where the boxes are dumped into the great iron-mouthed furnace, and burned to a crisp. Some of the fruit looks well on the outside, and only a close inspection would show the presence of the insidious worm that causes the orchardist so much alarm.

ALASKAN IN TOWN

JAMES M. SHOUP SPEAKS OF THE WONDERS OF THE NORTH.

TWO VAST INDUSTRIES THERE

Will Command the Attention of the World—Mineral Possibilities Cannot Be Surpassed. Good Indications.

James M. Shoup, United States marshal for the southern district of Alaska, with headquarters at Juneau, is in the city with his wife and child.

"Alaska is destined to become a great mining country," says Mr. Shoup. "With the exception of the Treadwell, which drops 840 stamps every day in the year save Fourth of July, there is not much mining being done around Juneau just now, but the cessation of work is only temporary."

"I was in Butte in 1892 and I now notice a great change for the better in the place. On the occasion of my visit then I met several prominent citizens, among them Senator Mantle, George W. Irvin and General C. S. Warren."

"I have been in that country four years," continued Mr. Shoup. "Prior to the division of Alaska into three sections I was marshal for the entire territory, but after the division I was assigned to the southern division. My district extends to Prince of Wales island, where some immense ledges of copper ore have been found. The Ketchikan country, in which the island is situated, is going to be a good one for mining. Outside of mining Alaska possesses another great industry, fishing. The two combined will make it a recognized factor in the history of the world's business."
