Section 1. That sidewalks be and the same are hereby ordered constructed in front of the following described premises, to-wit: In front of Nos. 31, 33, 35 and 37 North Main street.

Sec. 2. The said sidewalks to be constructed of the material and in conformity with the requirements of Section 4 of Ordinance No. 452 of the city of Butte, and hereby ordered constructed within ten (10) days from and after the passage of this resolution.

Sec. 3. The city engineer is hereby instructed to give notice to the property owners in front of whose property the above sidewalks are ordered constructed, to construct the same within the time limited by Section 2 of this resolution.
