MORRIS ACQUITTED

STATE MEDICAL BOARD PROSECUTES OSTEOPATHIST.

PRACTICING WITHOUT LICENSE

State Statute Defective—May Lead to Supreme Court Decision—Verdict Meets With Public Approval.

(Special to Inter Mountain.) Missoula, Nov. 9.—A case which has attracted considerable attention in Missoula for the past two days ended last evening when a justice court jury brought in a verdict of not guilty.

Dr. F. W. Morris was tried for practicing osteopathy without a certificate from the state board of osteopathic examiners.

Dr. Asa M. Willard of Dillon, secretary of the state board, was virtually the prosecuting witness, though the complaint was sworn to by a local official.

Array of Legal Talent. There was quite an array of legal talent on each side—County Attorney Hull and Judge Frank H. Woody prosecuting, and attorneys Marshall, Stiff, Evans and Collins defending.

A motion made to dismiss on account of the statute covering the case being defective, inasmuch as it does not define what osteopathy is, was overruled and the case proceeded with, but the faulty statute was responsible for the acquittal, the defense having the better of the contention throughout.

Verdict Gives Satisfaction.

The opinion prevails that the verdict in this case will lead to a supreme court decision declaring the law invalid. The verdict gives satisfaction, as Dr. Morris is a reputable practitioner in his line, and has a large clientele who are satisfied with his treatment, even if he does not hold a diploma from the Kirksville, Mo., school of osteopathy.

Organize Oil Company.

(Special to Inter Mountain.) Kallispell, Nov. 9.—The first local oil company, known as the Kintla Lake Oil company, has been formally organized, with Mayor W. H. Griffin as president, F. L. Gray secretary, J. R. Lisle treasurer, and these three with J. F. O'Meara, Judge D. F. Smith and County Commissioner Greig as a board of directors. The capital stock of the company is \$100,000, divided into 1,000,000 shares, at a par value of 10 cents each. The treasury stock is fixed at 750,000 shares. Fifty thousand shares have been placed on the market at 3 cents per share, and was promptly disposed of.

TIMBER PERJURY CASES.

U. S. Assistant Attorney General Will Arrive After Holidays.

(Special to Inter Mountain.) Helena, Nov. 9.—Judge Knowles of the federal court has been notified by the department of justice that the assistant attorney general of the United States, who is to come to Montana to prosecute the timber perjury cases, will not be able to argue the cases until after the holidays. Despite the fact that an agreement has been made between the attorneys to start the trial of the cases on November 18, they will doubtless be postponed until after the first of the year.

MISS HERRON TO MARRY.

Sister of Notorious Socialist Agitator Follows in His Footsteps.

(By Associated Press.) New York, Nov. 9.—Miss Margaret Evelyn Herron, sister of Prof. George D. Herron, the socialist agitator, has announced her engagement to marry Dr. Henri Berghall of Manistee, Mich., and the wedding will be conducted on the same plan which made sensational the marriage of Prof. Herron to Miss Carrie Rand. Miss Herron, who is now at Metuchen, N. J., is a firm believer in what she terms "the new and simple form of marriage," which is without the exchange of the usual ritual vows, and with none of the ritual or formulas of the church. She heartily approves the way her brother married Miss Rand. Miss Herron said that the man she is to marry is a socialist, a native of Sweden and a practicing physician in Michigan.

ENGLISH ART EXHIBIT.

Opening Shows Lack of Originality Among New Men.

(By Associated Press.) New York, Nov. 9.—The exhibition of the English Art club will be a dull show today, says a London correspondent. Moffatt Linder, who is usually in advance of his colleagues, has an impressionist study of a sunset off Christ Church harbor, with splashes of scarlet sky and dark metallic waters aglow with crimson fires.

Wilson Steer has two well-balanced landscapes, with a fine play of light in meadows and trees.

William Orphan has succeeded in filling a room with art and in emulating the realism of Sargent's Venetian interior is a picture entitled "A Window in a London Street."

The Best Portrait is Francis Bates' "Chess Player," and the only religious work is "Emmanuel," by W. Straub, with the central figure revealing himself to the eyes of the two disciples.

The opening of the exhibition contains little evidence that the new men of the English Art club are thinking for themselves.

Herbert J. Finn has a collection, a modern gallery of 78 water color draw-

ings of York's minister, Durham cathedral and other architectural subjects. These drawings are characterized by poetic sensibility and mellowness of tone, the best thing, an evening view of Durham cathedral, from the brink of the stream opposite the western towers.

LUETGERT FACTORY SOLD.

Famous Murder Case Recalled by Transfer of Sausage Factory.

Chicago, Nov. 9.—After lying in illness for over four years, the famous Luetgert sausage factory has been sold by the estate of the dead sausage maker. The plant was one of the most extensive private enterprises in Chicago, and it was within the gloomy brick walls of the big factory that Luetgert was accused of having murdered his wife in May, 1887, placing the body in one of the rendering tanks and thus consuming it in the crude potash. The trial of Luetgert was one of the most sensational in criminal annals and attracted widespread attention. He was sentenced to the penitentiary, and died there of heart disease.
