STABBED IN A FIGHT
JAMES McHALE, A MINER, SERIOUSLY INJURED.
KNIFE WIELDER NOW IN JAIL
J. C. Sullivan, a Stranger in Butte, Is Accused by the Victim of Having Done the Cutting.

James McHale, a miner, lies in St. Paul's hospital, very close to death, with a gaping knife wound in his chest, while J. C. Sullivan, who is accused of having done the cutting, is under lock and key at the county jail, where he will be held awaiting the result of McHale's injuries, which, it is feared, will prove fatal.

LIFE-BOAT IS LOST
(London, Nov. 14.—The loss of a life-boat and 11 of its crew, near Yarmouth, heads the list of today's wrecks by the continued gale.
The lifeboat was on its way to the rescue of a distressed vessel when it was struck by a great wave and capsized. The crew was imprisoned and only three of them succeeded in making their escape.
Innumerable casualties continue to be reported on all the coasts of the United Kingdom, marking the storm as the most disastrous that has occurred in many years.
Snow is falling in many parts of the country.
The Norwegian bark Erratic of Chistima has been wrecked in the vicinity of Saltburn and eight of her crew drowned.
An incomplete list of the persons who have lost their lives by drowning by the storm already aggregates over 100.
