Dr. Ignatius Donnelly received two votes and a majority of the members of the board was awarded the contract, so ordered the chair.

In the matter of smallpox physician for the county. It was ordered that the services of Dr. Sheeran as smallpox physician be dispensed with on and after January 1, 1902. And it is further ordered that Dr. A. P. O'Leary be employed to look after all smallpox and other contagious diseases in the county of the present house.
