MRS. BRENNAN THREATENS TO SUE MRS. REDPATH.

LATTER HAD HER ARRESTED

Brennan Says His Wife Will Ask for Big Damages—He and She Were Charged With Grand Larceny.

Mrs. Annie Redpath of this city is threatened with a suit for \$10,000 damages for having Mrs. Robert Brennan arrested. Robert Brennan, the husband of the latter, threatened the suit. Mrs. Redpath got out a warrant for him also, but he was in Pony and escaped arrest. Mrs. Redpath had Mrs. Brennan arrested on a charge of grand larceny, accusing the latter and her husband of appropriating a lot of Mexican table linen and silverware, her property. The Brennans had possession of the goods as the agents and bailees of Mrs. Redpath, who employed Brennan to sell them on commission. Brennan, who returned from Pony this morning, indignantly denied the charge of larceny and expressed the determination to make Mrs. Redpath pay damages.

This Is His Disclaimer.

"She employed me to sell the things and I went to Pony to do it, and then she had my wife arrested. I will sue her for damages. I was called over the telephone yesterday and told there was a warrant for me also, and I was dumbfounded. I came over this morning." "Who bailed your wife out?" he was asked. "A gentleman who is my friend," he replied. Then he related that Mrs. Redpath put the goods in his hands. They all lived in the same house, and she brought the goods into his rooms. He said that it was by agreement that he went to Pony to sell them. The goods belonged originally to a sister of Mrs. Redpath at Great Falls. Brennan sold the collection on the route to Pony for \$50. Mrs. Redpath recovered the silverware with a search warrant while he was gone. He is holding the \$50 on a claim for \$37 for commission, railroad fare and loss of time. He told his story to Deputy County Attorney Lynch, and the case against him and his wife will be dismissed, probably. Then, Brennan says, he will sue Mrs. Redpath and make her pay for putting his wife in custody.

SCALPERS' VICTORY

CHICAGO JUDGE DECIDES THAT ANY TICKET IS GOOD.

CASE DECIDED YESTERDAY

No Law That Invalidates a Ticket Because It Has Passed Through the Hands of a Ticket Broker.

(By Associated Press.) Chicago, March 27.—However reprehensible and odious to a railroad company a ticket scalper may be, there is no law that invalidates a ticket which is otherwise valid, because it passes through his hands. Judge Chytaus of the superior court has given this opinion in the suit for damages brought by Moritz Horowitz against the Chicago & Northern Pacific Railroad company. Damages of \$250 were agreed upon. While traveling with his wife to Minnesota, on a ticket purchased from a South Clark street scalper, which had originally been issued to a Michigan newspaper man, Horowitz was confronted by J. C. Pond, general passenger agent of the road, who happened to be on the train. Horowitz and his wife were ejected from the train at Lakeville, 51 miles from Chicago. The attorney for the road argued that Horowitz had been guilty of a constructive fraud.
