NEW MINING CAMP IS RICH IN GOLD

MORE ABOUT SUGAR LOAF MOUNTAIN WHERE THE DANIELS BOYS MAKE A BIG STRIKE.

SEVERAL PROPERTIES ON MOUNTAIN PRODUCERS

Experts Consider It One of the Greatest Districts Ever Discovered in Powell County—Construction of a Road From the Tunnel to the Valley Proves to Be a Difficult Undertaking.

[SPECIAL TO INTER MOUNTAIN.] Warm Springs, May 29.—The new gold camp near the head of Race Track creek is causing some talk in this section. According to reports, some of which seem to be reliable, the ore of a few of the claims there is rich in gold.

This camp is located about 18 miles from Race Track station, which is eight miles from this place, on the line of the Northern Pacific.

About 14 miles from the mouth of Race Track creek stands Sugar Loaf mountain, the apex of which towers 4,000 feet above the bed of the creek. It was on the north side and near the peak of that mountain that the Daniels brothers located several quartz claims about three years ago. The showing from the first is said to have been extraordinarily good.

Daniels Brothers Claims. It is claimed that mining men of experience recently visited the camp and wondered why the veins remained undisturbed for such a long time. It is alleged that the whole mountain side is covered with rich float rock.

For years the Daniels brothers and their partners, Richard Lacourse and Frank Jones of Anaconda, have been working the numerous claims they have located there. It is said they have 20 claims in all. The most work has been done on the Amazon and Independent. Ten men are now employed on the Independent, which, it is said, has a six-foot ledge of free milling ore that assays \$28 per ton in gold. It is claimed that there is ore enough in sight to warrant the statement that the Independent is one of the best gold mines ever discovered in Powell county.

Is a Rich District. On the Amazon and Gold Leaf the showing is said to be almost as good as that on the Independent, which adjoins them a few hundred feet below on either side of the mountain. It is said there are several tons of ore ready for shipment to the smelters in Butte and Anaconda, but no shipping can be done until the wagon road down the gulch is completed. Men are now at work on it. The mountain sides on which the mines are located are very steep, and it will cost considerable money to grade a road from the mouth of the tunnels to the creek in the valley below. Tom D. Daniels, one of the owners of the mines, has charge of the work.

STAMP MILL FOR BED ROCK GULCH

ERECTS IT TO HANDLE FREE MILLING ORES FROM GOLD BUG GROUP OF MINES.

PROPERTY SHOWS A GOOD VEIN AND PAYING ORE

Considerable Activity Is Reported From the North Moccasin Range—One Firm Is Doing Development Work on a Group of Promising Copper Claims in the Same District.

"John E. Lyons, the North Moccasin mining man, is in the city this week awaiting the arrival of the machinery of the stamp mill which he and his partners will erect on the Gold Bug group of claims in Bed Rock gulch, on the west slope of the North Moccasin range," says the Lewistown Democrat.

"The mill to be erected on the Gold Bug group is the one which was formerly on the Weatherwax properties in Yogo, and is now in transit between Yogo and Lewistown.

"The ores of the Gold Bug are free milling and the largest per cent of the values contained in them can be recovered in a stamp mill. The erection of the mill will begin as soon as the machinery arrives on the ground.

Free Milling Ores. "The ore body on the Gold Bug is a mineralized zone in the porphyry averaging about 20 feet in width, carrying values from \$3 to \$12 per ton in gold. A tunnel 50 feet in length has been driven on the ore and a large amount of ore has been broken down in an open cut which is a part of the development of the mine.

Other Rich Mines. "Lyons, Oliphant & Heising have also done considerable development work on the Blue Bell group of copper claims this spring.

"This group is also situated in Bed Rock gulch. The ores carry from 15 to 30 per cent in copper, 48 per cent lead, and about 18 ounces per ton in silver. A car load of ore is now on the dumps ready for shipment, and development has proven the permanency of the vein."

ABANDON STEWART LEASE

Holders Believe They Have Made All the Money They Can From Property.

Jack Hoy, Tom Hinds and others, who have been working a portion of the Stewart mine under lease during the last two years, will suspend operations June 1. Up to about three months ago they made money out of the property, but since then they have only been holding their own and have concluded to abandon the property. The ground is owned by Senator Clark, who has been working the portion of it not under lease to Hoy & Co.

TUNNEL OPENS A VERY RICH LEAD

CLAIMS NEAR PHILIPSBURG ON THE SOUTH BOULDER PROMISE TO BE A BIG PAYING PROPERTY.

DEVELOPMENT WORK MAY SHOW ITS REAL EXTENT

One Pay Streak Opened by Sam Snyder and Jasper Huffman Runs \$40 a Ton—Boulder District Promises to Be One of the Best in Montana Within a Very Few Years.

"Sam Snyder and Jasper Huffman expect to leave the city as soon as the weather will permit for their claims on the South Boulder, about seven miles from Philipsburg," says the Philipsburg Mail. "They have been working industriously on these properties all winter and believe they have ample encouragement to continue. They are running a tunnel and are in about 200 feet.

Make Rich Strike. "Below the tunnel they cut the ledge in four or five places, and in each it showed up very rich—the 14-inch pay-streak running \$40 per ton. The lead is about four feet wide. In the face of the tunnel where they are now working the pay-streak does not show up as well as it has, as it has narrowed down considerably. The owners, however, will continue work in the hope of its widening out to where it has been almost the entire distance up to within a few feet of the surface.

District Is Booming. "Rube S. Leveridge, the well-known Princeton resident, was in the city Monday. Mr. Leveridge says that the mining industry throughout his section (which means the Boulder mining district) is constantly on the increase, and he feels that they are just starting on an era of great prosperity.

"That district is one of the very best in the state of Montana, and it would be indeed hard to find one in which an equal number of rich gold leads exist. The coming season promises to be one of the very best in years. Much development work is expected to be undertaken in all parts of the district."

JOHN BARRETT OF THE WORLD'S FAIR

MAKES SPEECH AT HONOLULU ON HIS TRIP AROUND THE WORLD FOR GREAT EXPOSITION.

ADDRESSES BUSINESS INTERESTS OF HAWAII

Over Fifty Million Dollars of Invested Capital Represented in the Audience—Will Proceed Forthwith to Take Such Steps as Will Result in a Creditable Exhibit at St. Louis.

[SPECIAL TO INTER MOUNTAIN.] World's Fair Grounds, St. Louis, May 24.—When John Barrett, commissioner general to the orient for the World's fair, arrived at Honolulu on his trip around the world, citizens representing the commercial and industrial interests of the Hawaiian islands arranged a meeting for him in the government building, which he addressed.

Over \$50,000,000 of invested capital was represented in the audience. Mr. Barrett summarized the situation in the islands as follows: "The business interests of the islands will proceed forthwith to take such steps as will result in a creditable exhibit, to be accomplished if necessary by popular subscription, and supplemented later by act of the next legislature which convenes in the early part of 1903.

The intention expressed at Monday's meeting, and confirmed by the appointment of a committee, is that Hawaii shall have a greater exhibit at St. Louis than she had at any other exposition.

"It is one of the chief desires of this country that so-called 'Hula-Hula,' or low-class vaudeville midway effects, shall not disgrace these islands said Mr. Barrett. "I assured the meeting that the exposition management would heartily join with them in preventing such unfavorable features from being a discredit to the Hawaiian exhibit.

"In conclusion, I can state that I am more than satisfied with what has been accomplished in the taking of preliminary steps. During the few days that I remain here I shall be in consultation with the government officials and the committee named in regard to the plan and scope of Hawaiian participation.

"The newspapers, as you will see, have given particular attention to my mission and their editors have informed me that they will cordially support the movement which has been inaugurated.

By the time I leave for Japan on the Doria, May 8, I hope that the situation will be so well in hand that the final consummation of plans can be left entirely to the local committee."
