WALL STREET FEATURES.

Condition of Wheat and Removal of War Tax on Stock Transactions.

New York, June 16.—Alfred M. Lamar of the Consolidated exchange, says of the Wall street situation:

"The high condition of spring wheat was the bull factor in the Northwest wheat carrying roads, and the recovery in the market made further progress under the leadership of our specialties, the Grangers. Although rumors were plenty there was no definitely favorable strike news during the day, yet in the settled conviction of its speedy settlement traders are more and more taking cognizance of the other bull features in the situation.

"In spite of all sorts of predictions at the opening of the year of decreasing earnings actual returns have maintained the indubitable tendency toward improvement, averaging for six weeks past an excess of 10 per cent increases, not in gross, but in net over the already large figures of a year ago. While such conditions prevail there can be only one permanent direction to values, and that is upward.

"There is little doubt but that the removal of the onerous war tax of \$2 per hundred shares will result in a marked increase in the volume of stock dealings after July 1. What this means to the stock market manipulator will be appreciated when it is realized that it is no unusual thing in an active market for one pool to turn 100,000 shares of stock in a day upon which the government tax amounts to \$2,000."
