COMMERCIAL INTERESTS NEVER AS PROSPEROUS Great Highway Built Upon Which Most of the Hemp Raised in the Philippines is Taken to Market—Smallpox Epidemic Has Been Checked and Cholera Has Been Kept Out.

Washington, June 30.—The department makes public the report of Governor A. U. Betts of the province of Albany, P. I., to acting Governor Luke E. Wright, dated Albany, May 17. He says: "Perfect peace exists throughout the province and at the present writing there is not a ladron band on the hills. The work of the constabulary has been exceptionally satisfactory and as their organization becomes more perfect, I expect them to render a still better account of themselves. Commercial interests of the province, were never in a more prosperous condition than they are at present. There is plenty of work for all who desire it, and in fact the greatest complaint from the interior of the province is the lack of labor to work hemp fields.

AMERICAN TRADE ON SOUND BASIS LABOR SAVING MACHINES AND ELECTRICAL APPLIANCE IN GREAT FAVOR IN SCOTLAND.

Washington, June 30.—American trade in Scotland has been established on a sound basis, according to an extract from "Commercial Relations for 1901," which is now in press and which will be made public today by Frederick W. Emery of the bureau of commerce of the state department. The extract says: "The United States consul at Edinburgh says the growth of American trade is very significant of the possibilities of the expansion of our trade with the world at large. Our tools, both hand and machine, are in high favor. The demand for our machine tools is increasing. The tendency of trade in Scotland is favorable to American labor-saving machines in the more important of manufactures, and also for pumping and crushing, boring and for power purposes.

Old Den Opened by Workmen and Some Good Locking Coin Disclosed. Chicago, June 30.—In a long abandoned counterfeiter's den at Van Buren and Halsted streets, \$15,000 in spurious coin and currency and a complete counterfeiter's outfit, including plates for making \$1,000 bills, have been found in a secret vault. The discovery was made by workmen engaged in tearing out the interior of the building and caused a sensation in the neighborhood. A detail of police was called to prevent a mob of 100 people from looting the chamber of its spurious wealth. According to Captain Porter of the United States secret service, the money was cleverly coined and printed and would defy detection by most experts.

NEW YORK—A cablegram announcing the departure of General Caerres from Paris for Lima has caused a general feeling of uneasiness in Lima, Peru.

MANILA—A detachment of United States marines and a force of native constabulary have had an engagement with a large body of Ladrones in Morong province, Luzon. One marine and seven Ladrones were killed.

PAWTUCKET, R. I.—Street cars were stoned and obstructed by sympathizers of the striking conductors and motormen in this city and Central Falls yesterday. Two street railway men were hurt by missiles. After running to cars during the day the Traction company took all off at dusk.

ST. PETERSBURG—In a dispatch from Port Arthur, the correspondent of the Novoe Vremya blames the captain of the British vessel Honan for the recent epidemic of cholera at that port which caused the death of over 400 persons, nearly 300 of whom were Europeans.

HAVANA—A meeting of the negro element in Havana in which Juan Gualberto Gomez presided, was held here yesterday. It was declared that this meeting represented all the negro organizations of Cuba. Speeches were made denouncing the exclusion of the negroes from the Havana police force and demanding equal rights with the whites in all matters.

LONDON—Joseph H. Choate, United States ambassador, Joseph Chamberlain, colonial secretary of state, Mrs. Chamberlain and some of the colonial premiers now in London, were guests of the honorable society of Gray's Inn at luncheon yesterday and attended an intercession service for the king at the little quaint chapel of the society.

STEAMER OREGON IS RUN ON THE BEACH DANGEROUS TRIP TO NOME AND RETURN BY ONE OF THE OCEAN GOING PACIFIC COAST HULKS.

San Francisco, June 30.—A special to the Examiner from Seattle, Wash., says: The steamer Oregon is ashore at Dutch Harbor with eight feet of water in her hold. On the voyage north the Oregon began leaking badly before she passed Vancouver, going steadily to keep her aloft. She reached Nome, however, with two feet of water in her hold and her machinery very badly out of repair.
