

WALL STREET STOCKS

New York, August 20. — Louisville made a jump and Chattanooga rose 3/4. The market of stocks showed fractional gains before the market reacted in sympathy with realizing in Louisville and heavy liquidation in Colorado Fuel. Colorado Fuel made an abrupt break of 8 1/4 to 8 1/4, and became very feverish above the lowest.

St. Paul and New York Central advanced a point before 11 o'clock and the market became irregular. The prices moved up strongly in spot, apparently because of J. P. Morgan's return to the city.

The southwestern group made the best showing, led by Texas & Pacific and Denver & Rio Grande, which advanced 2 1/2 and 2 1/2 respectively. Vanderbilt and Morgan stocks responded moderately, with Northwestern exceptionally gaining 3 1/2.

Various other stocks reached a notably high level. Great Northern preferred, and International Silver improved 1 point, and a number of other less active stocks 1 and 2 points. Colorado Fuel rallied 3 1/4 from the lowest. Northern Securities was active on the curb at an advance of over 2 points.

Bonds were firm.
