RUNS AMUCK AND KILLS HIS PUPILS

AUSTRIAN SCHOOLMASTER LYNCHED AFTER MURDERING THREE OF CHILDREN UNDER HIM.

[BY ASSOCIATED PRESS.] Vienna, Oct. 8.—A fearful tragedy was enacted at Droisich, Bohemia, on Monday. A village schoolmaster, 40 years of age, while talking to his class, suddenly became insane, rushed to his desk, drew a revolver from it and ran amuck, shooting right and left among the terrified children.

Three pupils were killed and three dangerously wounded.

On hearing the shots and screams the villagers quickly arrived at the school and, infuriated at the sight which met them, lynched the schoolmaster.

BEAUMONT FIELDS SUFFER BY BLAZE

LOSS IS VARIOUSLY ESTIMATED AT FROM \$100,000 TO \$250,000—NO LIVES LOST.

[BY ASSOCIATED PRESS.] Beaumont, Texas, Oct. 8.—Reports received today regarding the loss sustained by last night's fire in the oil fields vary, although experts place it at from \$100,000 to \$250,000.

The number of tanks destroyed will not be known for several days, but is estimated at between 35 and 80. Thomas Cowles, an employe of Brice & Co., was probably fatally burned while working at the top of a derrick. He is the only one injured, according to the latest accounts.

MERGER FAVORED BUT NOT PASSED DEBATE OVER UNION WITH TRANSMISSISSIPPI CONGRESS IN IRRIGATION MEETING.

[BY ASSOCIATED PRESS.] Colorado Springs, Colo., Oct. 8.—The all-absorbing topic among the delegates to the national irrigation congress today is the question of the proposed merger with the trans-Mississippi congress.

The tendency on the part of delegates to favor the merger is constantly growing, and there is little doubt in the minds of most observers as to the movement proving successful.

It is being strenuously opposed by a strong faction, headed by F. J. Keisel of Ogden, Utah, on the ground that irrigation should be maintained as an issue, while the old leaders of the irrigation congress, headed by George Maxwell of Chicago and John Henry Smith of Salt Lake, are as strongly in favor of the merger, on the ground that the irrigation congress, in securing the passage of the irrigation act, has accomplished its mission, and should leave further matters in the development of the irrigation theory to the hands of the government officials to whom it now naturally falls.

An effort was made at the opening of the congress this morning by the opposition to merger to force on a vote by shutting off further speechmaking until the reports of the committees on resolutions and permanent organization had been heard, neither of which has yet been submitted.

They Are Coming to Time. The sense of the convention was to some extent determined by the voting down of this resolution. It is a fact that the merger proposition is new to most of the delegates, and the friends of the resolutions affirm now that their motive was not understood. The reports of both these committees will probably be received this evening, although they are being delayed as much as possible by the friends of the merger, in order that the growing inclination on the part of delegates in their favor may have a chance to crystallize.

At the morning session addresses on the great benefits to accrue to the people as a result of irrigation legislation were made by Congressmen Tawney, Stevens, Morris and Heatwole of Minnesota.

The afternoon will be taken up with the addresses of the numerous state engineers and Chief Hydrographer Newell of Washington on the practical phases of the problem.
