Mr. Mitchell was asked if he was going to Washington, in view of the meeting there of the executive council of the American Federation of Labor, of which he is a member.

"I probably shall not go today," was the leaders answer, but he would not say any more.

Among the many rumors started today by the arrival of Mr. Mitchell in New York was a report that the Erie railroad had decided not to act further with the other coal roads in settling the strike and would hereafter proceed independently.

Chairman E. H. Thomas of the Erie board of directors said today there was not truth whatever in this rumor. He also said that he had not seen Mr. Mitchell since he arrived in New York and had no appointment to meet him.

Shooting and Dynamiting.

Tamaqua, Pa., Oct. 9.—James Burnham, a striker, was shot through the heart and instantly killed by a soldier on guard duty at Brownsville, near here, early this morning.

Burnham is said to have been loitering in the vicinity of a non-unionist's house, which was partly destroyed by an explosion last week. The soldier called upon Burnham to halt, and this order is said to have been disregarded.

An unsuccessful attempt was made last night to dynamite a breaker owned by Slattery Brothers at Tuscarora.

In Wilkesbarre.

Wilkesbarre, Oct. 9.—The entire Third brigade, under command of General Gobin, is now in the Lackawanna and Wyoming valleys and has control of the country from Wapawalpen and Mocaqua, on the south, to Forest City on the north, a stretch of 60 miles.

The general's attention was called to statements made by company superintendents that the production of coal depends altogether where the troops

It was resolved that discussion on the merits of either side in the coal strike should be discouraged and the main question of getting coal the only consideration.

one car of a Lehigh Valley coal train were derailed during the night a short distance from the Latimer colliery. The derailment was caused by a big stone which had been placed on the track. Use Cocoonant Shells.

New York, Oct. 9.—The British steamer Marianne has been chartered by the Brauer line for the purpose of conveying 4,000 tons of anthracite coal from Hamburg, which was shipped to Germany last year. The Brauer line is said to have purchased 20,000 tons of Pennsylvania anthracite which has been lying at 20 different places in Germany and will have the coal shipped back to the United States at once. East Side confectionery establishments are supplying cocoonant shells to tenants for fuel. The shells are sold in bags of 50 to 100 pounds to a bag for 15 and 20 cents a bag.

Lull in British Trade.

London, Oct. 9.—There is now a distinct lull in buying of coal for American shipment, but prices all round are firmly held at advanced figures. The rise in coke on the one hand and in rates to America on the other, are now operating to affect prejudicially the shipment of pig iron to the United States, which has been such an important factor in the British export trade this year.
