


WILLIAM EDDY WILL BE POPULAR LEGISLATOR

UNCLE SAM IS ABOUT TO ISSUE A THIRTEEN-CENT STAMP, DESPITE SUPERSTITION.

OLD BEN HARRISON'S PHIZ IN THE DESIGN

In Connection With Which, a Few Remarks Concerning Our Stamps in General and Whose Beaming Countenances Do Them Grace, May Not Be Considered Inapplicable to Scheme.

Washington, Oct. 31.—As soon as the die proof of the first of the new series of United States postage stamps is approved by the postmaster general plates will be made and the stamp issued to the public.

Stamp experts who have examined the drawing for the new stamp say it will be one of the finest specimens of a postage stamp ever produced, not excepting the famous Columbian series and the Pan-American set.

SOUFRIERE INSPECTED BY TRIO OF MEN WHO KNOW WHAT THEY ARE TALKING ABOUT.

AND IT IS THEIR OPINION THAT THE POT WILL BOIL

Slight Eruption of Tuesday Last is Only Sample of What is to Come—Governor of the Windward Islands is Advised to Be Ready for Troubles, and Lots of It, at Any Time.

Kingston, St. Vincent, B. W. I., Oct. 31.—Henry Powell, curator of the government botanical station here; J. P. Quinton of the British botanical station in Sierra Leone, West Africa, and W. E. Foster of the British botanical station at Lagos, West Africa, accompanied by guides, visited the Soufriere volcano October 28 and spent an hour and a half on the summit.

Volcanic ejecta, almost red hot, and smoking profusely, has been heaped up around the interior walls of the crater to a height of several hundred feet.

The crater shows no signs of having been in eruption. The old crater has become more funnel shaped than formerly and is now deepest in its center.
