

AFTER A YEAR IT FINDS HIM AGAIN

OHIO MAN RECEIVES A NOTE WHICH HE HAS CAST INTO THE SEA IN A BOTTLE DEC. 22.

[BY ASSOCIATED PRESS.] Conneaut, Ohio, Nov. 5.—Charles Potti, a harbor merchant, this morning received from a little town on the coast of Norway a note which he cast adrift in a boat nearly a year ago.

Potti was returning from Finland, where he had gone for a visit, and the vessel on which he was a passenger encountered a terrible storm on the North sea. For six days the steamer was tossed about at the mercy of the waves and the passengers thought that they would not see land again.

On December 22 Potti inclosed a message, telling of his whereabouts and his home address, and offering \$5 for the return of the note in the bottle, and threw it overboard, never expecting to see it again.

This morning Potti received the message from Engelsviken, Norway, and with it was a letter stating that the bottle had been picked up in the Bay of Engelsviken, in Christiania fiord, by a little girl named Hannah Lauritzen. True to his promise, Mr. Potti sent a five-dollar bank note to the child with a request for her photograph.


