

CABLE STATION AT FANNING ISLAND

CLIMATE IS GOOD AND IT WILL NOT BE SO LONESOME WHEN THINGS ARE ALL FIXED UP.

BY ASSOCIATED PRESS. San Francisco, Nov. 18.—James Pinkerton, who was principal electrician on the cable steamer Anglia, which laid the British cable from Vancouver to Fanning Island, and who has lately been directing the work of establishing the cable station at the latter point has arrived here. In an interview he said:

"Suva, Fiji, will be the repair station of the British cable and the repair ship Iris, a vessel built especially for the work, will be stationed there.

"Fanning Island is not such a dreary place. The climate is good and there is abundant water of fine quality. Steamers call now once in three weeks bringing fresh meat and provisions. A staff of 15 will be maintained there, as the cable has to be kept going night and day. At present they are living in tents, but a San Francisco firm of contractors has a force of about 40 men now building first-class houses for the men.

"In course of time no doubt soil will be imported sufficient to provide lawn and gardens, for there is no soil there now, nothing but guano and coral and little vegetation grown except cocconut trees. The station will be in charge of David Cuthbert, formerly with the Direct United States cable company on the west coast of Ireland.

HOUCHEE COUCHEE DANCE IS BARRED

ST. LOUIS MIDWAY WILL BE A TAME AFFAIR AND ORIENTAL PEOPLE ARE MUCH PLEASED.

New York, Nov. 18.—That no dances labeled Asiatic are to be exploited in the Midway at the St. Louis Exposition has greatly pleased the orient, says a dispatch received by Miss Helen Gould from John Barrett, former minister to Siam, who is representing the exposition in the far East. The dispatch was read at a meeting of the board of lady managers of the exposition, held at Miss Gould's home in this city.

No decision has been reached by a committee of artists appointed to select a design for the official emblem of the St. Louis exposition. The jury found 250 designs, most of which were framed oil paintings and word was received that there were more which had not yet passed through the custom house.

CHINESE TRUST FORMED STOCKTON, CALIFORNIA

Will Control the Potato Crop of the San Joaquin Valley—Expected Raise in the Price.

BY ASSOCIATED PRESS. San Francisco, Nov. 18.—A unique association has been formed at Stockton, a Chinese trust, controlled and managed by Le Yun, a Chinese. The corporation is known as the San Joaquin Valley association and the promoters of the enterprise include nearly all the large owners among the Chinese of the island and river districts, so that by the combine, two-thirds of the potato crop of San Joaquin valley will be under control.

The association has fortified its position with several hundred sacks as available stock and a rise in price is expected at any time. Already large consignments have been sent to Los Angeles and south into Texas. It is the intention eventually to cover all Missouri river points.

HONOLULU CHINESE PLEASED

Government Reimburses Them for Loss of Their Property.

San Francisco, Nov. 18.—Acting Consul General Chou Yu Kang, representing the Chinese government at this port, has returned from Hawaii, where he went to adjust with a representative of the federal government the losses incurred by the Chinese residents of Honolulu through the burning of the section of the city in which they lived to stamp out bubonic plague. The amount of the indemnity agreed upon was \$800,000, one-tenth to be paid at once and the balance within a year. This, the acting consul general said, was quite satisfactory and he left his countrymen feeling well disposed toward the government of this country.

RUBINO REGRETS FAILURE TO KILL

BRUSSELS SAID TO BE MOST ACTIVE CENTER OF ANARCHISM IN ALL EUROPEAN COUNTRIES.

New York, Nov. 18.—Rubino, the anarchist who attempted to take the life of King Leopold last Saturday, has been confronted with another well-known anarchist named Mesdag and attempted to implicate him in the crime, but broke down under cross-examination, says a dispatch from Brussels by way of London.

In his cell Rubino continues to express regret at his failure to kill the king and declares he will commit suicide. It is certain, adds the correspondent, that Brussels is just now one of the most active centers of anarchism. A number of Italian anarchists recently left London for Belgium.

Courtesy Lenay (Princess Stephanie of Belgium) telegraphed from Brussels her congratulations on her father's escape not only to the king personally, but to all the members of the Belgian court.
