BANK PRESIDENT IS FOUND LYING

WITH A BULLET HOLE IN HIS HEAD
—SUICIDE AS A RESULT OF
BANK'S CLOSING.

Silverton, Colo., Jan. 3.—At noon today James H. Robin, the missing president of the bank of Silverton, which was closed yesterday on account of the president's disappearance, was found dead three miles from town. He had shot himself in the head. He was about 45 years old and leaves a wife and three children living in Denver.

Mr. Robin was principal owner of the Iowa-Tiger mine and chief promoter of the Camp Bird Extension company and heavily interested in numerous other mining ventures. He was reputed to be worth \$500,000.

The liabilities of the bank are said to be about \$300,000; assets unknown. It is generally believed that the bank is in sound financial condition and that Robin was mentally deranged when he killed himself.

FISTOL UNDER A PILLOW WENT OFF ACCIDENTALLY

Such is the Story Told by Chicago Woman Being Held for the Murder of Her Friend.

Chicago, Jan. 3.—Miss Bessie Palmer, who was shot yesterday by Miss Essie Barrett, was reported dying at the hospital today. Miss Barrett is under arrest.

Miss Palmer, known on the stage as Mlle. Asita, is quoted as saying that Miss Barrett, having returned home at 6:30 a. m. to the flat they occupied together, noticed in the parlor a prominent physician, who, Miss Palmer said, had been treating her. Miss Barrett upbraided the actress for "having such late company," and Miss Palmer responded sharply.

Then, Miss Palmer says, Miss Barrett shot her, the bullet severing the jugular vein.

"We kept the revolver under the pillows," said Miss Barrett today. "In shifting it from one side to the other it was accidentally discharged."

The physician is not connected by the police with the shooting.

TWO EIGHTY TON ENGINES

Collide Up in Canada and a Fireman is Killed.

St. Catharines, Ont., Jan. 3.—The Chicago Express, east-bound, consisting of two baggage cars, two day coaches and two sleeping cars, drawn by an 80-ton engine, collided today with another 80-ton engine, running light, just west of Merritton tunnel, on the Grand Trunk railroad.

Fireman Desautel was killed and Engineers Buckitt and Duke and Fireman Horning were seriously injured. Both engines and the baggage car were badly wrecked. Thirty passengers escaped with a bad shaking up, a few bruises and scratches. The cause of the accident is not known.
