Capturing of Big Prize.

CITY ASKED TO PAY \$20,000

Woman Who Fell on Sidewalk Says She Was Badly Hurt.

The prospect of another damage suit is staring the city officials in the face.

This time the city is asked to surrender \$20,000 for personal injuries alleged to have been sustained by Mrs. John J. Sullivan.

She has filed a claim for this amount with the city clerk through her attorney, John H. Baldwin.

The complaint alleges that Mrs. Sullivan fell on the sidewalk in front of 307 East Granite street, June 14, of this year, while walking with her husband.

A defect in the sidewalk caused her to fall. She was in delicate health, she says, which caused her to be prematurely ill and to suffer great mental anguish and bodily pain.

If the city rejects the claim, it is expected a suit for the amount claimed will be instituted in the district court.

TWO NEW REBEKAH LODGES

Mrs. David Meiklejohn, Organizer, Returns to Butte From Trip.

Two new Rebekah lodges have been organized in the state, one at Darby and one at Boner, their organization having been effected by Mrs. David Meiklejohn, who has just completed a tour of the Rebekah lodges of the western and eastern parts of the state.
