

A HIGH CHURCH BISHOP.

CASE OF HIS GRACE OF LINCOLN.

Accused of Ritualistic Practices, Which May Send Him to Prison as a Religious Martyr.

London correspondence: The good old bishop of Lincoln stands a fair chance of going to prison as a religious martyr. Public interest in his remarkable trial, which began this week, extends far outside the domain of church-going people.

The charges against the bishop of Lincoln are brought by an anonymous person in a letter to the bishop, which was published when he was officiating as bishop, and as the principal celebrant in the holy communion, he did the following acts in violation of the law of the church: (1) He used lighted candles on the communion table.
