

THE LATE JOHN PHILLIPS

Entertaining Sketch of His Trials, Triumphs and Final Defeat by Death.

An Eminent Artist and His Name Known All Over the Land.

Leonard W. Volk, the Celebrated Sculptor, Talks of His Old Friend—His Noted Subjects.

The Chicago Tribune of July 28 says: A brief dispatch from Helena, Mont., has announced the death in that city of John Phillips, the well-known portrait painter.

Mr. Phillips was a resident of Chicago for many years, and his artistic work adorns a hundred homes in the city. One of his most intimate friends was Leonard W. Volk, the sculptor.

Mr. Phillips always made money, but never kept it. I believe if he had been possessed of a million dollars he would have given it away as readily as he would a few cents.

John Phillips was personally known in Chicago since 1868. He was born in Paisley, Renfrewshire, May 8, 1822. The ruling passion of his life was a fondness for drawing.

He left the farm and for five years devoted his entire time to his profession. One day he decided to go to Albany and ask the politicians and statesmen at the capital for work.
