Admiral Walker's Hurtful "Pull" is not Doing One Arm of the Service Good.

Possibility that the President May Take the Matter in His Own Hands—Conflict of Authority.

Some of Admiral Walker's friends in Washington have suddenly taken the mood of the navy to heart, and are loud in their complaints that the continued agitation of the subject of the admiral's "pull" is hurting the navy, says the New York Times.

The blame is not to be laid on the newspapers for exposing the state in which Admiral Walker's "pull" has brought the entire navy, but on the secretary of the navy, who has power to put a stop to the whole matter, but does not do so.

The president must have thought it rather singular, however, that when ships were needed for actual service in any quarter of the world none was available.

There is also need for a ship at the Salvadorian ports just now, where there is a probability that more trouble will be made by the recent attempted seizure of the City of Panama.

It is possible that Secretary Tracy may have these facts brought to his attention by the president, so that the president may direct the attention of Mr. Tracy to them for the purpose of indicating a way by which the conflict of authority between Admiral Gherardi and Acting Admiral Walker is "hurting the navy," etc.
