PRIDE OF THE GALLATIN.

The New Town of Manhattan and on What Its Future is Based.

Manhattan Melting Company Developing the Resources of the Section.

The Largest Body of Productive Agricultural Land in the State—Desirable Class of Settlers.

MANHATTAN, MONT., May 21.—[Special.]—During the latter part of the fall of 1889 W. D. Flowers, of this place, consigned to Henry Altenbrand, a leading maltster of Brooklyn, N. Y., a large shipment of barley which had been harvested that year by Mr. Flowers on his Manhattan ranch. The barley was of such superior quality that it attracted attention wherever it was seen, and at Duluth, while the grain was being transferred from the cars to the elevator for shipment by water, a request was made that a grade be given it, but this the grain inspector of the elevator refused to do, giving as his reason for refusing, that the grain was so far ahead of anything of the kind that he had ever seen, that he could not properly grade it.

As soon as the cargo reached its destination, the Brooklyn maltster, a thorough test of it was made, its superiority over all others established, and a move immediately set on foot not only to purchase the entire crop, but also all of the especially adapted lands in the vicinity of Manhattan, where the barley was produced.

It is to be noted that the plan thus set in motion it became necessary for Mr. Altenbrand to visit this favored section in person, which he afterwards did, with a result so extremely satisfactory to himself and others interested that upon his return to Brooklyn, or soon thereafter, a deal was closed with the owner by which the lands were purchased, and the Manhattan Melting company was incorporated with the following officers: Henry Altenbrand, Brooklyn, president; Jacob Ruppert, New York, vice-president; Frank Higgins, New York, secretary; John G. Gillig, New York, treasurer; George Kinkel, Jr., general manager.
