

A TRANSPARENT FRAUD.

The Special Championship Arranged by Republican Politicians on Pension Matters.

A Leading Grand Army Thus Designates Them in a Letter.

He Foresees His Former Allegiance and Will Give His Support to Cleveland and Stevenson.

New York, Oct. 10.—Chairman Carter, of the republican national committee, has received more bad news. He has been hearing considerable of late about the way in which republicans have been joining the ranks of the democracy, and when the news came in that District Attorney William Green, of Fulton county, a conspicuous Grand Army man, had come boldly out for Cleveland, Chairman Carter felt very much annoyed.

Mr. Green has sent a letter to T. F. Reed, secretary of the National Veterans' Tariff Reform league, in which, after stating that he has voted for every republican president from Lincoln down, he announces that he cannot longer agree with the party with which he has so long affiliated. He is opposed, he says, to both the McKinley tariff and the force bill. Mr. Green says at the close of his letter: "The republican politicians seek to put a pension in a most humiliating position. They assume, and scarcely take the trouble to spread a decent veil over the assumption, that they can bribe with pensions. Now, surely no self-respecting veteran can accept a pension as a gift, but only as a just right earned. The whole people, irrespective of party, are willing to deal not only justly, but generously, with the veterans, and the special championship arranged by republican politicians is a transparent fraud, indeed, the increased cost of living which the McKinley tariff imposes rests with special severity upon the shoulders of our comrades, the vast majority of whom are poor men, with small and constantly decreasing ability to earn a livelihood. Nor should it be forgotten that all the pension laws, of which republican politicians boast, with one solitary exception, (the law limiting attorney's fees in claims for increase,) were enacted by republican agents. It is a concise and perfectly correct characterization of the whole pension system that it was devised and molded by claim agents primarily in their own interests, and conducted by politicians to catch voters. The same expenditure of money would have been infinitely more beneficial to the veterans had congress honestly regarded their rights and interests, instead of seeking mainly to please a hostile power which was supposed to influence or control their votes."

ANOTHER CAMPAIGN FREAK.

"Capt. Jack" Crawford Serving an Engagement Under Chairman Carter. NEW YORK, Oct. 10.—Another attraction has been added to the large list of curiosities playing engagements about the country under the management of the republican national committee. The latest political freak was picked up yesterday, when it was determined to send "Capt. Jack" Crawford, the post agent, into the country to explain to the people why they should vote for Benjamin Harrison. He will join the "girl brigade," the standard-and-tea-party battalion, the veteran newsway and all the other odd things which make up the working force of the Harrison campaign. "Capt. Jack" called at headquarters yesterday and tendered his services. He wore his broad sombrero, and his hair flowed in ringlets down upon his shoulders. He was as picturesque as he usually has been, with his parade in eastern cities, where at odd periods during the last few years he has been posing as a scout from New Mexico. He offered his services to the committee and they were accepted.

A Combination in Michigan.

DETROIT, Oct. 10.—The democrats have gone into combination with the populists on the legislative candidates, to control, if possible, the choice of United States senators by the next legislature. They have endorsed each other's nominations in twenty-six cases so far, and the legislative nominations are not all made yet. The understanding is that the populist candidates are first named, as they have been in most of the districts, they shall be at liberty to vote as their first choice for Eugene H. Belden for United States senator. When the candidates become hopeless they are then to support the moderate candidate, who will probably be Gov. Winans.

Fusion in Minnesota.

ST. PAUL, Oct. 10.—The democratic state central committee this afternoon withdrew D. B. Hibbs, A. L. Sackett and James Brown from the electoral ticket, and inducted in their respective places William McLaughlin, James Dillon and R. L. Stromberg, the populist candidates. They also endorsed A. H. Hallway, of the populist party, in place of John C. Oswald, who resigned some time ago.

Republicans Declined to Fuse.

ATLANTA, Ga., Oct. 10.—The republican electoral ticket of Georgia has not been fused with that of the people's party. This was decided at a called meeting of selected candidates. The question was put to them whether they would fuse with the people's party to the same number of the people's party nominees. The refusal was emphatic.
