

KIT CARSON'S FAMILY.
A Short Sketch of the Famous Indian Fighter's Kindred.
Christopher Carson, the famous pioneer, guide and Indian fighter, was married at Taos, N. M., on the 23 of February, 1843, says the Trinidad Advertiser. His first child, Charles, was born May 1, 1850, and died April 1, 1861. His second child, Julian (Billy), was born Oct. 1, 1852. He was for years sheriff of Costilla county, and died there several years ago. His third child, Teresina, was born June 23, 1855, and is now living at Homersville, near Las Vegas, N. M. His fourth child, Christoval, was born June 12, 1858, and is now living at Las Animas, Col., and is commonly known as Kit Carson, Jr. His fifth child, Charles, was born August 2, 1861, and is now residing at La Junta, Col., and possessed more nearly all the noble characteristics of his famous father than any of the rest of Kit Carson's children. His sixth child, Rebecca, was born April 13, 1864, and died at Springer, N. M., April 13, 1885. His seventh child, Esterfanta, was born December 23, 1866, and is now the wife of Thomas Wood, residing at La Junta, Col. His eighth child, Josephine, was born April 13, 1868, and is now the wife of William Squires, residing at Oklatone, N. M. All of Kit Carson's children were raised, till of age, by Thomas O. Boggs, who resides near Clayton, N. M. Mrs. Boggs is a niece of Mrs. Kit Carson, Sr. Mrs. Jesse Nelson, residing in Otero county, is a sister of the pioneer. There are no brothers or sisters of Mrs. Kit Carson now living.


