

BUTTE COMPANY LOST.

Judge Knowles Decides in Favor of the Pacific Cable Railway Company.

It is an Infringement of the Hallidie Patent for a Grip Car.

Adverse Decision for Jones in His \$10,000 Case Against the Montana Company, Limited.

When the United States circuit court met yesterday Judge Knowles handed down two opinions. The first is in the case of the Pacific cable railway company vs. the Butte City street railway company for infringing a gripping device which seizes the cable, and to the dummy is attached a passenger car.

The judge says the claim of defendant that under the patent the gripping device was a permanent one while there was but a temporary one, is not a good one, and that the evidence shows that it could be removed.

The order of the court is that the complaint have a decree as prayed for which gives an injunction to the complainant and an accounting of the profits made by the defendant and for damages.

THE SUPREME COURT.

It Reverses a Decision of a Lower Court and Orders a New Trial.

The case of Rachel E. Creek, appellant, vs. John McManus et al., respondents, was reversed yesterday and a new trial ordered by the supreme court. The opinion is by Associate Justice DeWitt, the other justices concurring. The plaintiff brought the action to recover against the defendants damages for the alleged wrongful issuance of an injunction. McManus brought an action for an injunction against the plaintiff, and in such action, gave the attorney undertaking, with Chene and Davis, the other defendants herein as sureties. That action was for an injunction only.


