



**IN ANGRY SEAS.**  
 Revenue Cutter Experiences Heavy Gale—Mining Along the Yukon.  
 SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 9.—The United States steamship Mohican and revenue cutter Corwin have arrived here from Barrow sea. Both vessels experienced heavy gales off the northern California coast, during which the Corwin's starboard davits were carried away and two of her boats smashed. The revenue cutter Bear is still in the north, and will not arrive here before December. The Corwin left her first officer and four men at St. George Island, and dispatched Lieut. Jacob to one of the waste islands to enter sealing schooners that put in there for the winter. The Bear also dropped her first officer and four men on St. Paul Island.  
 Some miners in the Yukon country have made lots of money, though the season is very short and rockers can only be used about three months. Many of the prospectors were starving, however, and rather than to empty food for them during the winter, the trading company at Forty Mile, which runs some small steamers on the Yukon, shipped forty of them down to sea, to be distributed among the United States vessels about to sail for Puget Sound and San Francisco.

During the season the Bear also took 150 reindeer from Siberia to Fort Clarence. At Fort Clarence the reindeer are multiplying rapidly and in a few years the government will not have to send provisions up each year to keep the natives alive.

**Chili Pays the Indemnity.**  
 NEW YORK, Oct. 9.—The Chilean government has paid into the state department \$245,564.35, the amount of the judgment rendered by the Chilean claims commission. The awards will be paid by the state department immediately, as follows: Central and South American Telegraph company \$28,687.69; W. S. S. Wrigley \$4,821.70; Gilbert Bennett Borden \$8,726.13; Walls, Fargo & Co. \$27,735.23; Jennie R. Road \$1,081.08; Edward C. Dubois \$147,470.40.
