KOLBITES TALK FORCE.

And Claim They Have Evidence of Fraud in Alabama. Montgomery, Ala., Nov. 13.—In the Kolb convention last night a heated wrangle arose over the question of re-christening the party, which in a partial report from the special committee has been dubbed the people's and Jeffersonian party. The result of the argument was that the convention of Jeffersons and populists resolved themselves into the National People's party. Chairman W. H. Skaggs, of the committee on resolutions, read a report which stated that the committee had ample proof that Kolb was elected last August, and had been counted out. Dr. Crow, of Perry county, paced up and down the theater aisles and declared he should be seated, even if bloodshed were necessary, and that on Dec. 1 the populists and republicans should meet at Montgomery, and if the state military interfered with them it would be enough men to handle them. These revolutionary sentiments were backed up in stout talks by a number of men, until Skaggs finally resumed reading the report, which said that the evidence was at hand to prove the fraudulent election of Governor-elect Oates, and if the legislature did not right the wrong the federal congress would be called upon and a force bill demanded if necessary. The convention adjourned sine die after adopting the report. Not a suggestion of a double-barreled legislature or government is contained in the resolutions.

ALUMINUM IN CLOTH.

Novel Use to Which This Metal Is Adapted. Some new textile fabrics are now being produced, the novel features of which consists in weaving or intertwining threads of aluminum, or alloys of it, with the material used, in some cases employing that metal alone, for the purpose of making the cloth, gold and silver threads have been employed in the manufacture of fancy cloths, as is well known, but only or principally for the purpose of ornament and not as a means of insuring greater strength and durability. The present invention provides a practically non-oxidizable, inexpensive metal that can be utilized in quantities in cheap cloth, and which can be washed without fear of injury. It is claimed that cloth made wholly or partly of this material will be free from chemical action, as few substances affect it. An attractive lustre is obtained, which renders the fabric very ornamental, and there is the additional advantage of the metal being equally applicable to the finest fabrics and to the heaviest. The wire or threads can be drawn to any degree of fineness, so that it may be employed in combination with silk, linen and the like—it may also be drawn round, flat or in any other form convenient for weaving. —New York Sun.

TRAIN ROBBED.

By a Gang supposed to Be of the Cook Outlaws. Monett, Mo., Nov. 13.—The St. Louis & San Francisco passenger train due here at 7:50 p. m. was held up and the express car robbed, three miles east of this city this evening. At Verona two masked men boarded the tender of the engine and concealed themselves until a heavy grade, and deep cut were reached, when they sprang from their hiding place, covered the engineer and fireman with Winchester, and commanded them to stop the train. Climbing over the tender into the cab, the bandits marched the engineer and fireman to the baggage car and commanded them to open the door. Messenger Chapman refused to comply, when the bandits, now six in number, threatened to blow up the car with dynamite. Engineer Stevenson called to the messenger and implored him to open the door, which was done. The bandits entered the car, plundered it, and in full view of the terrified passengers, clambered up the hill and made their escape. Messenger Chapman succeeded in hiding all the money save \$200, which he handed over to the robbers. They are supposed to be a part of the Cook gang. According to reports to Superintendent Simpson, the sum was \$215. Messenger A. M. Chapman is a brother of the messenger killed in defense of his car in Kansas a year or two ago. He was himself held up at Red Fork, I. T., last June, but saved all the money he had.

POTATO PERFUME.

Odoriferous Essences Derived From the Humble Vegetable. "There is one odoriferous essence in very common use," said Dr. F. G. Coalter, of Indianapolis, at the Laclede last night, "of which the majority of people know nothing whatever. This is potato starch, distilled from potato spirit. No one would suppose that humble vegetable capable of yielding a perfume. Yet it does yield three, and very good ones they are. They go by the names of rose, apple and grape oil, from a resemblance between their odors and these fruits. Confectioners use them largely to perfume their finest candies. Chemistry tells some queer stories about perfumes. It is found that the sole constituents of juniper oil, attar of rosemary and that of lemons and turpentine are really the same, seven parts carbon, with one of hydrogen. We cannot combine these substances so as to form any one of the perfumes mentioned, nor explain why, with the same constituent parts, they exhale odors so different. Eau de cologne, which won fame and wealth for not only a family, but a city, is really indebted to the orange for most of its charm, there being four different perfumes distilled from it which are used as ingredients in eau de cologne." —St. Louis Globe-Democrat.
