CROKER, 2:19 1/2, is to be bred to Dictator. RARUS and Pickard pulled 660 pounds through the mud in 2:23 1/2 last week. CLINGSTONE is said to have lately trotted a quarter in thirty-two seconds—a 2:08 gait. GALOPIN, the English thoroughbred racer, has been sold to Mr. Chaplin for \$40,000. The crack Western three-year-old race-horse, Leocrates, has reached Long Branch. UNALATA, full sister to St. Julien, is running out this season on the farm of her owner. MONA has been sold by Captain Cottrill for \$4,000 to Samuel Brown, of Pittsburg, Pa., who bought Buchanan for 5,000. FANNY WITHERSPOON is showing great speed. John Splan recently drove her in 2:15 1/2 in a fourth heat. She will prove a flyer in the circuit. THE receipts at the late meeting of the Coney Island Jockey Club footed up \$105,000, of which amount \$50,000 will be devoted to improvements, a dividend of 3 1/2 per cent. being declared on the stock for the six months. J. R. KEENE has made a number of entries for the Epsom Derby of 1885, and it is probable that his stable will be the only one from this side of the water represented in the great English race, as Mr. Pierre Lorillard has broken up his Newmarket stable, bringing home the best of the horses and selling the rest. THE owner of Clingstone has expressed his willingness to hitch that fast trotter with any gentleman's horse to go a fast mile, and would buy such a horse, not so much for the purpose of making future fast miles or beating 2:15 1/2, as for the satisfaction of owning and driving the fastest and most perfect gentleman's road team which a mate and match to Clingstone would make. In the opinion of a Cleveland expert, 2:14 would be their limit. Hitched with Maul S., he could doubtless trot in 2:12, and I think he and St. Julien could trot to that mark, or he and Rarus would go fully as fast; besides there are several others that could be hitched with Clingstone to beat 2:15 1/2.
