

TELEGRAPHIC.

SAN FRANCISCO, August 4.—A fire on Post street destroyed almost an entire block, the buildings being burned to the ground. Among them was the Winter Garden theatre and Druids' hall. The loss is estimated at \$3,000,000. The extent and area of the fire is the greatest that has occurred in the city since 1876. Over two-thirds of the entire block is in ashes. It was evident before the first engine reached the scene that the fire would be one of the most disastrous and difficult to cope with on account of the peculiar construction of the Winter Garden Theatre, the place where the fire originated. The theatre is a big frame building filled with inflammable material and covered with an asphalt roof. No fire ever occurred before in this city where the flames spread with such rapidity. In fifteen minutes the buildings on both sides caught, making the heat so intolerable as to make an attempt to enter them impossible. When a general alarm was sounded every effort was made to prevent the spread of the flames. Patrols were organized, ropes stretched across the streets, so as not to impede the firemen. A strong fight was made to save Elintrachts, Red Mens, Druids' Hall and Pacific College, but was unsuccessful, and when the flames devoured the latter, it seemed as if the whole block must go, including Trinity Church and the National Guard Armory, but the brick walls of the latter saved the church. From a little below Sutter, on Stockton street, to the armory on Post street everything was a seething mass of flames, but the efforts of the firemen confined it to those boundaries.
