

TELEGRAPHIC.

St. Paul, January 4.—Private advices from New York give the following as the new list of officers of the Northern Pacific Railroad:

President and General Manager—Thos. F. Oakes.

General Superintendent and Chief Engineer—Adna Anderson, who is now Chief Engineer.

Superintendent of Transportation—J. T. Odell, now Superintendent of the Eastern Division.

Toronto, January 5.—The funeral of the victims of the recent railway catastrophe was attended by an immense multitude. Business was entirely suspended, the employees of many firms participating. A number of establishments were draped in mourning. The coffins were conveyed in sleighs draped with black and preceded by a gun carriage bearing a coffin containing the remains of Sergeant Mulligan, the Royal Grenadier. The procession was one hour passing a given point. Ten bodies were interred in St. James Episcopal cemetery, eight in St. Michael's Roman Catholic cemetery, one in the Necropolis, and one at Mt. Pleasant.

All the patients are doing pretty well with the exception of Alex Turniff, who is in a critical condition. Turniff's brother is among the killed. New York, January 5.—A decision has been rendered in favor of the defendants in the suit of Dennis D. Malachy against O'Donovan Rossa and others as trustees of the Irish skirminish fund. When Colonel John O. Mahoney, the Irish patriot, died in 1877, Rossa was deputed by the plaintiff to accompany the remains to Ireland. Malachy was to receive \$1,000 out of the skirminish fund for expenses. He says he only received \$537, and brought suit for the remainder. The court held that the plaintiff had not acquired any lien on the fund.

Galveston, January 5.—Dr. Edward Laker, a brother of Morris Laker, who is one of the leading merchants of this city, died in New York this afternoon. Flags are flying at half mast in Galveston to-day, as a tribute of respect to the dead statesman.

St. Louis, January 5.—At 9 o'clock tonight a fire was discovered in the extensive furniture establishment of Burrell, Comstock & Co., North Fourth street. Owing to the intense cold the firemen worked to great disadvantage. The building and contents were entirely destroyed. Loss, \$125,000; insurance, \$90,000. The jewelry house of Merrick, Walsh & Phelps and the house of Witmer, Gray & Kaminski, china and glassware, occupying the adjoining building, also burned. Merrick, Walsh & Phelps' stock was valued at \$50,000, and it is believed the most of it is secure in fireproof safes. Witmer, Gray & Kaminski's loss is estimated at \$75,000; insurance, \$50,000. At midnight the fire is still raging and it is feared the Goolyer rubber store will burn; it is already damaged by water to the extent of many thousand dollars.
