Editor Husbandman: We write to ask you to correct an error in an item in your last issue. viz: Dornix is not the name of the territory at our station on the N. P. railroad, but "Big Timber," which is the railroad name of the station and name of post office. Dornix was the name given to the shack town by the construction department of the N. P. railroad at the crossing of the Boulder and one mile east of the present town of Big Timber. As Big Timber is an important shipping point to a large portion of Meagher county it may perhaps be of interest to some of your readers to know what is there. I will briefly state that the company have built a first-class depot and telegraph office, and placed in charge their gentlemanly agent, Mr. Pough. W. R. Bramble presides as landlord over a first-class hotel and feed stable. R. B. Dunham has a general store. James McRee also has a nice assortment of goods. There are two or three saloons, among which is Brooks Bros. billiard hall and saloon. Another hotel is in course of erection. The Montana Lumber Co. have two steam saw mills, with shingle and planing machinery attached. They get their logs on the headwaters of the Boulder and drive them during high water to the mills. They are making measurements and estimates for a toll bridge across the Yellowstone and will doubtless construct one in the early spring. A first-class ferryboat is owned and managed by Sam Kieger. The townsite is owned by J. R. Anderson, who is selling many lots to people who will build residences and business houses next season. Every facility is now offered travelers and shippers at this point. G. M. H.
