

TELEGRAPHIC.

ENGLAND. LONDON, March 15.—In Berlin to-day it was semi-officially announced that the principal powers of Europe had agreed to join in a confederation proposed jointly by Germany and France for the suppression of all anarchical forms of socialism.

The attitude of Switzerland is a serious disappointment to Bismarck, and it is believed, will eventually cause the abandonment of the proposed confederation which would be impracticable so long as Switzerland was offered as a harbor to anarchists.

In Paris much uneasiness is caused in diplomatic circles by official information from Berlin to the effect that a sudden and extraordinary activity has developed in the German navy. The Imperial admiralty has just issued an order commanding the immediate doubling of German marines and sailors.

FRANCE. PARIS, March 15.—Waddington, the French ambassador to London has telegraphed to Prime Minister Ferry that Feng the Chinese ambassador, has asked Earl Granville, the English foreign secretary, to mediate between China and France.


