

TELEGRAPHIC.

LONDON, Nov. 10.—The Franchise bill was passed by the House of Commons in committee of the whole without amendment. The result was greeted with cheers. The under secretary of the colonial department, in replying to an inquiry, said it was true that the British minister at Washington had been instructed to negotiate a reciprocal commercial arrangement whereby America should remit in part the duties on West Indian sugar, and the West Indians should take off the duties on certain articles imported from America; but no arrangement was contemplated, and no proposal had been made whereby the West Indies should impose differential duties on English as opposed to American Manufacturers.

The President has issued the following proclamation: "The season is nigh when it is yearly wont for this people to observe a day appointed for this purpose by the President as an especial occasion for thanksgiving unto God. Now therefore in recognition of this hallowed custom, I, Chester A. Arthur, President of the United States, do hereby designate as such a day of general thanksgiving Thursday, the 27th day of this present November, and I do recommend that throughout the land people ceasing from their accustomed occupations do keep holiday at their several homes and their several places of worship and with heart and voice pay reverent acknowledgment to the giver of all good for countless blessings wherewith He has visited this nation."
