

TELEGRAPHIC.

PITTSBURG, Dec. 20.—After an illness of several months the Steel works of Hussey, Howe & Co., will start up next Monday.

BRILLIANT, Ohio, Dec. 20.—The Spaulding Iron Works, which have been closed down for some time, will resume in all departments next Monday.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., Dec. 20.—The fire at Thorn Creek wells which began yesterday is extinguished, except Fisher No. 8, which is still burning furiously. The loss will not exceed \$30,000.

NEW YORK, Dec. 20.—The weekly bank statement shows a reserve decrease of \$1,565,000. The banks now hold \$40,688,000 in excess of legal requirements.

THE coroner's jury was empaneled to-day, but the inquest was adjourned. The funeral of the victims will take place to-morrow and the interment will be in the cemetery of the Holy Cross of Flatbush. About noon when the workmen had almost concluded that there were no more bodies buried beneath the debris, they came upon a group of six more, all of which were burned to a crisp. This makes sixteen bodies in all recovered.
