REVERSES DECISION IN 80-CENT GAS LAW

Washington, Jan. 4.—In an opinion of Justice Peckham, which was unanimously concurred in by the entire court, the supreme court of the United States today reversed the decision of the United States circuit court for the southern district of New York granting an injunction against the enforcement of the 80-cent gas law.

The decision of the court did not deal with the constitutionality of the law, but left the inference that that question would depend upon whether the law was constitutional.

Justice Peckham said that a bona fide test should be made under the opinion of the law before appealing to the courts for its nullification.
