person, which statement must be by the assessor filed with the clerk of the district court and by the clerk preserved.

Income Tax. I further recommend that a graduated tax upon incomes with appropriate exemptions be provided. I fully realize that the many difficulties surrounding the execution of such a law, but such difficulties should not deter us from the enactment of this most just measure.

I am under the impression that the adoption of the provision above mentioned requiring the courts, in the settlement of estates, to investigate the matter of the escape of property from taxation, would have a wholesome effect in preventing misrepresentations of income.
