SENATORS DISCUSS THE PANAMA CANAL

Washington, Feb. 9.—The entire question of the type of canal that should be adopted in the construction of the Panama canal was before the senate today, Senator Kittredge, chairman of the committee on inter-oceanic canals, and Senators Foraker and Teller all declare that they believe a great mistake has been made in adopting the lock project. The discussion grew out of a report by Mr. Kittredge on the bill increasing the limit of the cost of the canal to \$500,000,000 and authorizing the secretary of the treasury to issue bonds to that amount.

Senator Kittredge said that while the engineers of the canal zone had originally placed the cost of a lock canal at \$100,000,000, they had now increased their estimates to \$400,000,000, whereas it had been estimated that a sea level canal would have been built for \$247,000,000.

BRAKEMAN IS KILLED IN RAILROAD WRECK

Muskogee, Okla., Feb. 9.—One man dead and two seriously injured and property damaged to the extent of \$30,000 were the results of a fire following the collision of a switch engine with a train in the Missouri, Kansas & Texas yards here tonight. The dead: J. M. QUINLAN, brakeman, Parsons, Kan.

FLATHEAD INDIAN PRAYS FOR DIVORCE

Both parties to the petition are full-blooded Flathead Indians, and were regularly married in 1901 and lived together until 1903, when the squaw fled from Polchens's tepee.

ST. PAUL TUNNEL IS OPEN

nel indicated that much soft and wet ground had been encountered, retarding the progress to a marked degree, although the substance being pierced at the time on the Idaho side was still of a hard nature and made good drilling.

A Great Record.
Standing out against the record made on the St. Paul pass tunnel in November, 731 feet 5 inches, are the following figures, which have been obtained from engineering reports:

The Simplon tunnel, pushed through the Alps, is over 12 miles long and was begun in 1900 and finished in 1905. Until the feat of Winston Brothers on the St. Paul pass tunnel the month's record of 685 feet 5 inches on the Simplon drive stood as the pinnacle in tunnel boring.

The Arlberg, another tunnel sent through the Alps, was driven a distance of 641 feet in one month. Another penetration of the Alps is the Albulia tunnel, which was drilled in a distance of 607 feet in one month. The substance through which this bore is made is known to geologists as anti-gorio gneiss, and was drilled by use of the Brandt rotary drill.

In Switzerland a record of 574 feet was made during one month last year on the Loetschberg tunnel, which is still in process of construction. Percussion drills are being used in the construction of this tunnel.

The Karawanken bore through the Austrian Alps was sent in a distance of 553 feet in a month during the year 1905, and in the same mountain the Tavern and Bosruck were pushed 548 and 546 feet respectively.

In New York city the new Groton aqueduct tunnel was drilled a distance of 550 feet during one month in the year 1887, through exceedingly hard rock and with an unusually large heading.

The Ricken tunnel in Switzerland was forced 461 feet in one month by means of hand drills, but the work was stopped on account of fire damp flows. The work has not been attempted since suspension in the year 1903.

The St. Gotthard pass tunnel was cut 436 feet in 30 days in the year 1881 with a Brandt rotary drill.

GRAND JURY INDICTS TWENTY-SEVEN

ALLEGED TIMBER THIEVES OF OKLAHOMA MUST FACE UNCLE SAM'S COURT.

Muskogee, Okla., Feb. 9.—Indictments against 26 representatives of big corporations charging them with stealing valuable timber from segregated lands in Oklahoma were returned by the federal grand jury here today. An additional indictment was returned against one person for impersonating a United States officer in furtherance of the scheme of alleged timber thieves. The alleged thefts occurred chiefly in the Choctaw, Chickasaw and Seminole nations.

Judge Campbell issued strict orders that no names of the indicted persons be given out until after they have been arrested. Tonight United States Marshal Grant Victor dispatched 10 deputies on a southbound train to arrest the persons indicted, who reside chiefly in Letford, McCurtain and Choctaw counties. They will be brought here Wednesday and required to give bond.

For years the government has been harassed by timber thieves representing big corporations capitalized in the east, which have been stealing from segregated Indian lands on the Sugar Loaf, Backbone, Winding Stair and other mountains millions of dollars worth of pine, walnut, oak and other valuable timber. When the government inspectors reported the thefts it has been the custom of the timber thieves to admit their guilt and pay certain amounts into the treasury of the Indian agency in lieu of the value of the timber stolen. Then the thieves would promise not to commit any more depredations upon the forests, only to forget their promise, and there has been a continual repetition of the offense for years. Finally the United States district attorney, W. J. Gregg, grew tired of this way of handling the thieves, and the indictments returned today are the result. Government inspectors have spent months collecting evidence.
