GLEASON'S GIANTS GRAB GAME

GROTESQUE EXHIBITION IS WON WHEN SOLDIERS TAKE AERIAL FLIGHT IN SECOND.

In a game replete with errors of omission and commission, the Missoula Giants triumphed over the Fort Missoula team on the south side ball grounds yesterday afternoon by a score of 12 to 5. Except for the excellent battery work on the part of the Giants' heaver and backstop, there were no features worth mentioning other than the fact that Gleason's lads were able to annex a total of nine runs in the second inning, due to a mess of bingles by the Giants and hobblies by the soldiers.

Main, pitching for the town team, was in splendid form, and hurled good ball throughout the pride of Uncle Sam reaching him for only eight scattered hits. Main's control was nearly perfect, he issuing only two passes during the day. He whiffed five of the opposition and helped the hit column of his team by three, singling twice and placing a neat two-bagger over second in the third inning.

Cheveller, a handsome youth with a puzzling cross-fire delivery that had the Giants breaking their backs most of the time, made his initial appearance before a down-town crowd and showed up well enough to warrant the belief that he would be some heaver if he had a real ball team behind him. It was no fault of the soldier twirler that the Giants scored nine times in the second inning, for he pitched good ball, even with his support gone to the eternal bow-wow. Temporarily the khaki-clad pitcher soaped and heaved too high for Kler to stop the pitch, but at that the lads were excited before a down-town crowd and in front of him was booting the ball to the farther corners of the lot. During this session every man of the Giants came to bat, Hart and Gleason facing the pitcher for the second time before the side was retired. Hart even scored twice, but the captain fell down on his own second attempt. Five errors committed during the crazy period, besides an equal number of bone-headed plays, coupled with wild pitches, passed balls and five hits by the Giants, got the soldiers in a bad hole, from which they were unable to creep during the remaining innings.

Cheered on by a goodly number of fatigue-clothed young men who occupied the grandstand and the bleachers, Cheveller struck out eight of Gleason's men, getting the captain himself three times out of four times up. Even Fred Smith, who usually clouts the ball in fair territory, has three or four vertebral dislocations resulting from his own frantic efforts to reach the elusive slow delivery of Cheveller. ON TO TURKEY.

Washington, May 2.—The American armored cruiser squadron, composed of the North Carolina and Montana, which left Guantanamo, Cuba, April 23, under orders from the navy department to hurry to Alexandria, Turkey, to protect Americans there, was 1,150 miles west of Gibraltar last night, according to a cablegram received at the department today.

The vessels are traveling at the rate of 15 1/2 to 16 knots an hour, and at that speed officials of the bureau of navigation say, the squadron should reach Gibraltar on Tuesday or Wednesday next. They will receive orders to continue to Eastern Mediterranean waters.
