SEND MUCH MONEY TO JAPAN

By reason of jealousy, ignorance and conservatism the fight for steam introduction to the navy was one of desperation and had to be urged point by point. Congress in 1876 had authorized the construction of a steam vessel for the navy, but not until nearly the close of President Jackson's administration was the work begun which resulted in launching the United States steamship Fulton in 1837.

Mr. Haswell occupied an official position in the navy for fifteen years and through a period of wonderful activity in steam naval progress. In this time he designed the complete machinery for ten warships. He was the organizer of the engineer corps, and did more to overcome the prejudice against the introduction of steam power than anyone else.
