DR. JAMES M. BARKLEY DELIVERS ADDRESS TO PRESBYTERIANS AT DENVER.

Denver, May 22.—Nine great services of a devotional character marked the activities today attendant on the annual gathering of the general assembly of the Presbyterian church.

Rain marred the great parade planned for Sunday school children. A popular meeting in behalf of home and foreign missions was held in Central church in the afternoon, and in the Denver Auditorium the Rev. Charles Stetzel of New York addressed several thousand laboring men on the subject of labor conditions over the United States.

There were five popular meetings this evening and in its many different churches in behalf of various movements.
