MARKET MOVEMENTS OF THE DAY

New York, June 15.—An effective element of the professional operators of stocks perfected a sufficient organization and gathered courage today to attack prices of stocks with vigor and met with success in precipitating a sharp fall in prices. No threatening development was discernible to account for the apparent urgency with which stocks were pressed for sale. The weakness was attributed generally to technical causes. The rash into prominence of a miscellaneous lot of obscure specialties is considered a bad sign of the health of the speculation. The outcome of these testing operations was to encourage the bear operations in which short selling was extensive and offering down of prices followed boldly and with effect in moving stock prices downward. As is usual when prices turn definitely downward, there was a withdrawal of buying orders below the market price with the determination to take advantage of a possible reaction in what was supposed to be a strong market. With the reaction in force this determination is relinquished in many cases, no small sentimental effect being produced on today's market by the violent decline in American sugar.
