

BLEACHERS OF FLOUR BUTTE MEN'S CASES IN DANGER BEFORE MINERS

MILLERS WHO CONTINUE PRACTICE ARE LIABLE TO GET INTO TROUBLE.

Laramie, Wyo., July 28.—That western millers who continue to bleach flour will invite the seizure of their products by federal inspectors, was made known here today through a letter received by State Food Commissioner Butler from Secretary of Agriculture Wilson. The impression had grown among western millers, said Mr. Burke, that the government would content itself with two or three test cases and until a decision of the supreme court no more seizures of bleached flour would be made.

MATTERS INVOLVING FEDERATION MEN COME BEFORE CONVENTION AT DENVER.

Denver, July 28.—At the session of the Western Federation of Miners' convention the cases against John R. Sullivan, former treasurer of the Butte local, Thomas Booher and P. W. Flynn were considered. Sullivan, who was twice tried on charges of shortage in his accounts as treasurer of the Butte local, appealed from the decision of the executive board, which had set aside the second verdict of acquittal on the ground that a man could not be twice placed in jeopardy and which allowed the first verdict of guilty to stand. He appealed from this decision, as did Booher. Both appeals were laid on the table.

a neighbor in the other end of the car, used as a kitchen. Costello called his wife in, closed the door behind her, stepped to a bureau in the room and took out a revolver. He flourished the weapon above his head, shouting to McMillan: "You and this woman have caused me lots of trouble and I've had about enough of it." As Costello drew his pistol down to the horizontal, ready to fire, McMillan and Mrs. Costello both grappled with him, calling loudly for help. As they struggled for possession of the gun, all three fell to the floor and the firearm was exploded. The bullet passed through the left arm of Mrs. Costello and entered her husband's brain just in front of the left ear and in line with the eyes. His death was instantaneous. It is thought that the weapon was in the possession of McMillan when it was discharged, as he held the pistol when he arose.

MONTANA FARMERS MUCH ALIVE

WOULD RECOVER CUP



THE EARL OF LONSDALE.

London, Eng., July 28.—England does not intend to let the international polo cup, won by the American Meadowbrook team recently, remain long in America without an effort to recapture it. The Earl of Lonsdale, the Duke of Westminster and the Duke of Roxburgh held a conference recently and discussed plans for sending a team to America next season to retake the cup. No defeat in sport for years past has so humiliated the Englishmen as this. Polo is almost as much the English national game as cricket. Lonsdale was formerly a polo enthusiast and still maintains his interest in the game. He is enormously wealthy and with his two associates will if necessary finance the sending of a team across. If necessary to mount the team adequately, the king of Spain, himself a pony polo player, will loan a bunch of his ponies to the Duke of Westminster. It will be a fine spectacle for Meadowbrook to see a polo team coached by an earl and two dukes try to recapture the cup in 1910. P. W. Nickalls of the defeated British team says: "The Americans can hit straighter than we can. In winter we hunt. They play tennis and racquet. There is no better practice for polo driving. If they ever get the ball within 50 yards of the goal they hit a goal if they can get a stick at the ball. They had the best ponies also, and their lot at Hurlingham was worth between \$50,000 and \$75,000. When all has been said the Americans are the best sportsmen. I don't care what you take—cricket, rowing polo; I've done most; they are the best sportsmen in the world."

ROLLER-KAUFMAN GO HANGS IN BALANCE

Seattle, July 28.—The first step in an attempt to open Seattle to boxing matches was taken today when John Curt, proprietor of the arena at the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition, secured a temporary injunction against Sheriff Robert Hodge restraining him from interfering with the six-round boxing match between Dr. B. P. Roller and Al Kaufman, scheduled for next Friday night. The temporary injunction is made returnable tomorrow morning.

Monday Sheriff Hodge formally notified the exposition management that he would not permit the Roller-Kaufman bout to take place. Immediately following the receipt of this notice the fight promoters called off the dog, but after consulting attorneys decided to take the matter into the courts.

AN APPEAL IS TAKEN.

Kansas City, Mo., July 28.—An appeal to the United States supreme court from the decision of Judge Smith McPherson in the Missouri railroad rate cases was filed by Sanford B. Ladd, representing the state, in the United States district court here today. In his decision, Judge McPherson declared that the Missouri railroad passenger and freight rate law was confiscatory and unconstitutional.

ARRESTED FOR DEBT.

Geneva, Switzerland, July 28.—Mrs. Thomas Appleton of Seattle, Wash., has been arrested on complaint of the proprietor of a hotel here, where she had been stopping since last May, for failure to pay a bill of \$600. An American pastor has assumed charge of Mrs. Appleton's 19-year-old son and 17-year-old daughter pending their mother's release.
