

CALLS ON THE BOYS AND GIRLS BALLOT TO DECIDE JOHNSON'S FUTURE

OFFICIAL OF DRY FARMING CONGRESS WANTS THEM TO SECURE EXHIBITS.

Denver, July 31.—Professor W. H. Olin, vice president of the dry farming congress, has called upon the boys and girls of Colorado to prepare exhibits for the international dry farming exposition which will be held at Billings, Mont., October 25-29, inclusive.

"This year Colorado has good prospects for a representative crop. Can we interest the boys and girls on Colorado farms in taking crop samples for exhibit purposes? To those living on non-irrigated farms the dry farming congress, to be held at Billings, Mont., next October, extends a very earnest call to send personal exhibits for the congress.

Cleveland, Ohio, July 31.—Mayor Johnson's most desperate of all traction campaigns is practically ended and the city is greatly stirred over the referendum election to be held next Tuesday. It is of tremendous importance, for upon its outcome hinges not only the fate of the indefatigable mayor's latest 3-cent-fare traction ordinance, but the success of the fight which he has kept up ever since he became mayor of this city, eight years ago.

He lost the former referendum election last fall by 609 votes in a total of 75,000. That election knocked out the grant upon which Mayor Johnson was given control of the entire traction system under a lease from L. E. company.

The former bull leader took it and entered the market as a buyer of September option, basing his action on the strength of the cash situation in the southwest. Severe hail damage in a 20 miles territory in the northwest and sporadic black rust reports combined to make the trade nervous.
