The varieties which are best in the local field have been given prominence in the assignment of prizes, and there are special inducements offered for the display of large quantities of apples, as well as for the plate exhibits. Every farmer and fruitgrower in the state should secure a premium list this week and prepare his exhibit for this apple show, which is to be attended by more people than have ever seen a display of this sort in western Montana. There is enough monetary inducement to make it worth while for farmers and orchard men to make careful preparation; the prizes are large enough to make it worth their while. Added to this fact is the consideration of the advertising which the exhibitor will receive. There will be thousands of people visiting the show; a display that will attract their attention will interest some of them in the man who makes the display. The management of the show has arranged sufficient display room for all who wish to exhibit. It will be possible for every farmer to show what he has raised this year; the more exhibitors, the better the display. The better the display, the greater the benefit of the show to the farmer, to the orchardist and to the merchant. The prizes are to be paid in cash; there will be no delay in their payment after the award has been made by the judges. A fair competition is assured, and the man with one plate of apples or one sheaf of wheat will be on an even footing with the man who shows a carload of apples or a stack of grain. The amount of premiums is greater than any offer ever made before for a show of this sort in Montana. The offer is worth the consideration of every man who has anything to exhibit.

For your home locality by a generous participation in the exhibit at this apple show. The show is held under the auspices of the Montana State Horticultural Society, aided by the Missoula Chamber of Commerce. The Horticultural Society at its annual meeting arranged for a show of this kind to be held in Missoula this fall; the chamber of commerce has taken up the active management of the affair under the direction of the fruitgrowers, and the county commissioners have made a liberal appropriation for premiums. Here is offered an opportunity for every fruitgrowing district in the state to advertise the excellence of its fruit and to measure merit with other districts. The show is to be held in the central part of the city of Missoula; it will be open day and night; there will be thousands of visitors who will see Montana fruit on exhibition for the first time. There will be no long drive to a fair ground, and the man who has a half hour at his disposal can drop into the exhibition hall and see part of the show, making another trip when he has more leisure time. The fruit will be arranged to the best advantage and the exhibits will be carefully attended to while they are on display. It is to the benefit of the merchant to have the show in the city; it is to the benefit of the fruitgrower, because more people will see his exhibit; it is to the benefit of the visitor, because he can see the show more handily than if it were held in the suburban districts. All conditions are for the success of the show; it will be a great chance for the advertisement of the agricultural resources of the valleys of the state, especially those of western Montana. The management urges all sections to arrange for a good boosting exhibit, each from his own district. In this way the Western Montana Apple Show will fulfill its purpose completely.
